Technology & the Law

Technology Law covers a breadth of practices including, but not limited to, patents, trademark, copyright, data privacy and cybersecurity, artificial intelligence regulation, and the regulation of drones and other autonomous vehicles. Lawyers and law makers need to pay special attention to issues of preemption, ethics and liability insurance coverage (both personal and professional) as the use of AI and other emerging technologies becomes more widespread. Practitioners handling matters in these areas will also need to have some understanding of the underlying technologies and be able to learn quickly as they advance.



Loyola's Cybersecurity and Data Privacy Law programs offer classes and experiential-learning opportunities to prepare students for the evolving legal demands presented by emerging technology. The first of their kind on the West Coast, the programs draw on Loyola's strengths in technology, criminal justice, privacy and IP law.
